Background and career history

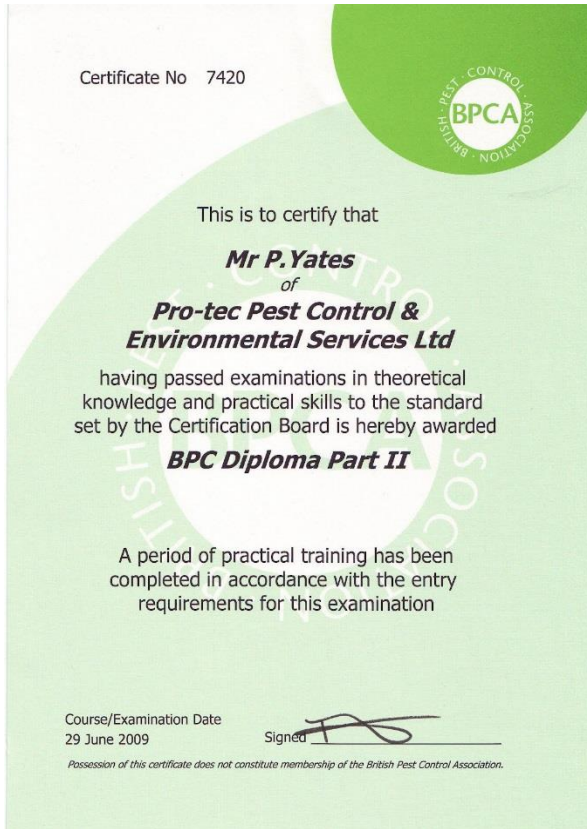
Pete's career in pest control began with the small independent pest control company Pro-Tec Pest Control. He started as a technician, obtaining his BPCA/RSPH Level 2 Certificate in Pest Control in 2006, and progressing to the BPCA Advanced Technician qualification in 2009. He then added the CIEH Level 3 Award in Supervising Food Safety and, in 2011, the BPCA Certificated Field Biologist qualification. During his time with Pro-Tec, Pete was instrumental in the training and coaching of the company's pest control technicians.

In 2012 Pro-Tec was acquired by Rentokil. Pete continued in his role of Field Biologist, as well as assisting staff and management with the transition and amalgamation of the two company's services and working practices. Rentokil provided Pete with an insight into managing the pest control requirements of high profile sites on a national level, covering plants manufacturing pharmaceuticals, baked goods, meat processing and dairy, as well as national wholesale retail and distribution sites. He also completed the Aspiring Managers programme and Train the Trainer courses in 2014.

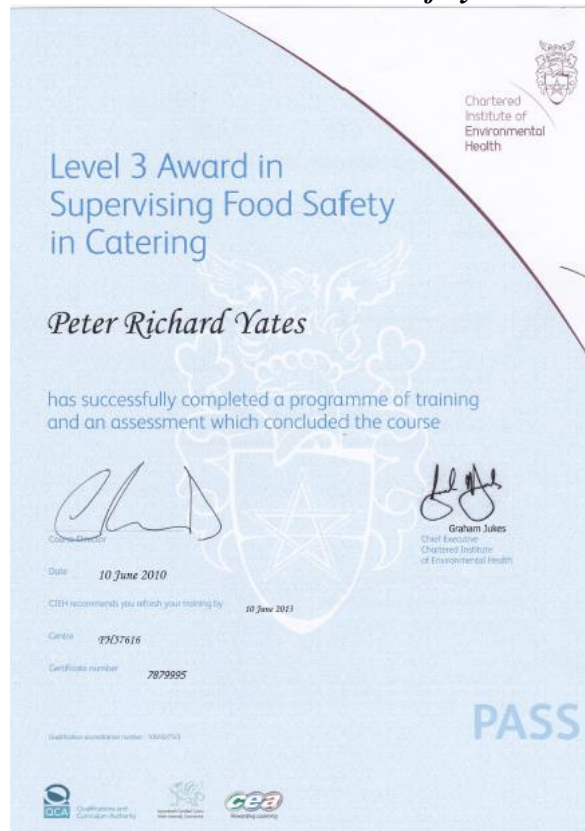
